## INSAF IMPROVES PROJECT OUTPUT IN YR 2003; LIFE MEMBERSHIP CONTINUES TO BE A HIT

INSAF posted an improvement in the project support in our most recent fiscal year ending December 31, 2003. However, it was still about half compared to the record high posted in the Year 2000. Here are the highlights:

Project output was at \$18,395 for the Year 2003. This compares with \$14,750 for the Year '02 — implying an almost 25% improvement. However, the INSAF effort equaled \$30,617 for the Year '01, and \$36,075 for the Year '00.

This year major credit goes to **Dr. Ashok & Dr. Hema Varma** for their \$5,000 contribution for the Little Angels School in Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh, and **Joginder and Meera Kundra** for their contributions totaling \$5,000 for programs in the Jharkhand state.

**Dr. Ram Chaudhary** once again came through with his exemplary service in contributing \$4,000 for the Bhulpur Shiksha Samiti in U.P.

This year also saw some major collaborative projects at INSAF. Over 10 families combined to raise \$990 for Phase II of getting a Primary School finished up in the Rapar district of

Gujarat to support earthquake reconstruction efforts there. **Rajeev Paliwal** served as the Project leader in this effort. Another collaborative project of 4 families provided the \$550 as the Culinary School tuition for Ram Pravesh, a youth at the Bal Niketan Children's home in Panchkula, Haryana. Collaborations were also seen in \$950 for SODHANA in Chipurupalli, Andhra Pradesh, and \$450 for the Sri Sai Vidya Mandir School in Alwar, Rajasthan, supported by **Laxmi & Vijay Varma**. Credit is also due to **Santosh Chokani, Brij & Shail Agrawal, Ashok & Usha Sachdev, Surinder & Nirmal Maheshwary, Soma and Parvathy Murthy, Om & Veena Garg**, and several others for remembering that Projects are the real reason for INSAF's existence. **INDIA TRIP REPORT . . . . . PROJECT HONOR ROLL FOR YEAR 2003 . . . . .**

Neal (our high school senior), Anjana (our 3rd year college student), Kaye and I made our umpteenth visit to Northwest India in Dec-Jan. Apart from noting that cell phones are now ubiquitous in India, this report will focus on several INSAF related visits.

1. Bal Niketan, Panchkula, Haryana
2. SOS Children’s Village, Rajpura, Punjab
3. Teacher, SR Arya Higher Sec School, Patiala, Pb
4. Bihari Migrant Workers Basti, Nangal, Punjab

Panchkula is a town next to Chandigarh, the joint capital of Punjab & Haryana. INSAF colleagues have supported 4 children at Bal Niketan in recent years (currently 2). We also passed along some children’s clothing on behalf of a California Rotary Club, and a few tennis balls I save regularly. Bal Niketan remains a place where children are well taken care of and seem in very good spirits.

Rajpura is a town in Punjab about 20 miles north of Patiala. The SOS organization is active in 131 countries. In India, it has 34 locations caring for about 200,000 children, each of whom have lost both their parents. Rajpura is one such location which we visited along with the local Rotary Club. The SOS vision is to have 8-10 children in a home being cared for by a “mother”. The “mother” is a trained and modestly paid lady who lives with the kids just like a mother might. The Children are supported by 2 social workers. It seems like a great concept, and INSAF is looking into sponsoring one or more children there.

A brief visit was made to a teacher who coordinates a small “alumni friendship” annual award to 3 students and 1 teacher at Patiala (please see page 4 for more).

Nangal, of course, is at the feet of the Bhakhra Dam at the Punjab-Himachal border. Our mission here was to take some more of the clothing provided by the California Rotary Club to some

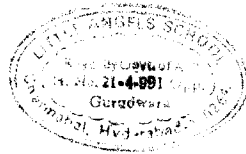

The statement from Harsha Infotech to the left shows the detail on the purchase of computers with funds provided by Dr. Ashok and Dr. Hema Varma to the Little Angels School in Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh. Assuming an exchange rate of about Rs. 47 per dollar, the school was able to purchase 4 computers for about \$477 each.
