PROJECT EFFORT ALMOST MATCHES THE 2nd HIGHEST YEAR .. WEBSITE DOMAIN NAME IS UPGRADED ... NEW EXEC TERM BEGINS

Much good news to report in this issue of the Newsletter. To implement projects in the areas of education, awareness, community development, and support for the disadvantaged is the real reason INSAF exists. Hence our project output is the most important metric. For 2004, the total project effort of \$30,495 nearly matches the \$30,859 for the Year 2001. Compared with the previous year of 2003, the project effort improved by almost 66% — not bad.

The major credit for this goes to **Dr. Ashok & Dr. Hema Varma, Dr. Ram Chaudhary, and Joginder and Meera Kundra.** The Varmas provided \$10,000 to support the Little Angels School in Hyderabad (AP), the Chaudharys and their family/friends \$4,450 for the Bhulpur Shiksha Samiti (UP), and the Kundras \$6,900 for education projects in Bihar and Jharkhand, and for the Indian Prime Minister's Tsunami Fund.

The depth and breadth of the projects improved as well in 2004. The projects covered 10 states in India, and also the U.S. There were 20 projects on the honor roll — a good year from the perspective of breadth for INSAF. In addition, 12 projects got supported at or over \$250 (above Rs. 10,000) — which is good from a depth perspective. Congratulations are also due for these efforts to Ashok & Darshan Mehan, Santosh & Perviz Chokhani, Bhav & Kaye Sharma, Raj & Padmashri Lad, P. and Susheela Harshavardhana, Manju Chexal, Ashok & Usha Sachdev, Aruna Marathe, and Surinder & Nirmal Maheshwary.

Declining costs of domain name ownership also meant that INSAF could finally upgrade its web site name to INSAFWEB.ORG during the first quarter of 2005. This had been a recommendation made several times in the past by several colleagues, including former INSAF member and now NJ assemblyman **Upendra Chivukula**.

Finally, a blend of the old and new takes over as the INSAF Exec for 2005-2007. Our immense gratitude is due to outgoing Execs **PK Malhotra** and **Prem Bajaj**, who served as Execs for many years, and what is more, are continuing to work on projects for the future. PK is continuing to help the Exec and Prem has continued to do good work with the India Heritage Project. We are very fortunate to have **Soma Murthy** and **Kumar Kapur** continue in the Exec, and to have the talented and experienced members **Harshavardhana** and **Ashok Sachdev** join the Executive Team.

Currently, funds are being collected at INSAF and the project specifics are being prepared. Harsha is the Project Leader. Friends.

A recent project supported by 3 INSAF families has resulted in sponsoring two female children in Punjab through SOS Children's Village.

My hope is we continue with vigor many projects INSAF members have initiated over the years and start some new projects.

PROJECT UPDATES

Samanwaya Ashram, Bodh Gaya, Bihar

Jo and Meera Kundra are supporting the education of — believe it or not — 1,100 children — in a project run by Shri Dwarko Sundrani, who is 84 and a follower and friend of the late Shri Vinoba Bhave. This exemplary project will require \$13,200/year.

Arya Samaj School, Sonari, Jharkhand

A major upgrade of the building facilities at this Sonari school has been underway and the Kundras are supporting it with a \$2,500 contribution which will pay for one room.

Dayananda Public School, Jamshedpur, Jharkhand

This school of 92 students has been working hard to provide quality education to its students. Thanks to the \$650 sent by the Kundras during 2003-2004, five teachers were each given a modest first-ever bonus ranging between Rs. 500 and Rs. 2,000.

Adivasi Child Education, Lathakhaman, Jharkhand

The Kundras had provided a \$4,000 contribution in 2003 to support the work of the Village Hope Foundation run by Dr. Subhash Chandra, a 1967 Physics Ph.D. from Caltech. About 300 children are getting education up to the 4th grade and the addition of another grade is planned this year.

India Heritage Project

The objective of this project is to provide unbiased and useful information resources on India to libraries in the United States. In an example of the usual terrific INSAF collaborations, books purchased and donated by former Exec Sant Chokhani and Life Members Raj & Padmashri Lad, two sets of books were provided to the North High School Library and the Public Library in Wichita, KS by former Exec Prem and Raj Bajaj.
