INSAF SETS NEW RECORD FOR PROJECT EFFORT

We often say in this Newsletter that our total project output is the most important metric to measure our collective effort to implement projects in the areas of education, awareness, community development, and support for the disadvantaged. These are the real reasons INSAF exists. In 2005, the total project effort surpassed the \$50K mark for the first time in the 33 year history of INSAF — a new record at \$54,916. The previous highest was \$36,075 for the Year 2000. Compared with the preceding year of 2004, the project effort improved by an impressive 80%. As is our tradition every first issue of the year, Page 3 of this Newsletter presents details for the most recent 3 years.

The major credit for this year's effort goes to **Dr. Ram Chaudhari, Dr. Tarun & Dr. Kamal Kothari, Vasu & Lalitha Vasudevan, Joginder & Meera Kundra, and Arun & Padma Cariappa.** The Chaudharis and their family/friends raised \$10,301 for the Bhulpur Shiksha Samiti (UP). The Kotharis provided \$10,000 to support a trust dedicated to improving the health and education of the needy in Raipur, Chhatisgarh. The Vasudevans and their friends, with \$9,750, are initiating a new project in Kerala (please see Page 5). The Kundras continued their major support with \$8,300 for education projects in Bihar and Jharkhand. The Cariappas and friends raised \$3,000 for a major effort to educate the children in the slums of Mysore, Karnataka.

Of course, it took 17 other projects along with the above to set the all time INSAF record. Page 4 has our famous "Project Honor Roll" which shows the depth and breadth of the projects improved in 2005. The projects covered 14 states/territories in India, and also the U.S. There are 22 projects on the honor roll — an excellent year from the perspective of breadth for INSAF. In addition, 17 projects were supported at or over \$250 (above Rs. 10,000) — which is good from a depth perspective. Congratulations are also due for these efforts to Ashok & Darshan Mehan, Nirmala Bidani, Santosh & Perviz Chokhani, Raj & Padmashri Lad, Harsha & Susheela Harshavardhana, Manju Chexal, Ashok & Usha Sachdev, Soma & Parvathi Murthy, PK & Suresh Malhotra, Gopal & Shibani Chotani, Jay & Shashi Shetty, AJ & Thankamma Poulose, Manoj & Maneesha Shrivastav, Kumarji & Sudesh Kapur, Om & Veena Garg, Ramesh & Pratibha Paliwal, and Bhav & Kaye Sharma.

PROJECT SITE VISIT REPORT Ramalingapuram, AP

A group of INSAF members, calling ourselves the Palo Alto Group, recently started a new project called the Village Adoption Project. This long-term project is being implemented in the village of Ramalingpuram in Andhra Pradesh in collaboration with Sodhana — with whom



INSAF has had a long-term relationship. On Feb 28, I spent the day at Ramalingapuram along with Dr Rao of Sodhana. This was a very exciting and informative visit. The highlight was a visit to the village school. This School has 214 children from 1st thru' 7th grade.

We are concentrating on grade first and second grades to start with (photo shown above). These children will be taught general and health awareness thru' the medium of cultural programs. Volunteer youth group will write and perform messages thru' songs and plays.

In order to develop their minds, children have to stay in school. Girls should not give up education to help the family. Every one should follow basic hygiene rules.

To support these issues, women in the village have also formed a group. 30 women meet once a month to discuss the welfare of the village and get rest of the people involved in development of the village. I was most impressed by the dedication of these women, enthusiasm of the children and hard work of the young volunteers to write, practice and perform these cultural programs with a social message.

NEW CHILD SPONSORSHIPS

We are very pleased to report that thanks to **Joginder & Meera Kundra**, two more young people have joined the family of 9 others currently sponsored by INSAF members.

The first of these is 2-year old Akanksha Singh (right, top). Akanksha had arrived at the SOS Children's Village, Rajpura, Punjab on 30 Nov 2005, only about 2 months before this INSAF sponsorship was finalized. Akanksha is loved by all her bothers and sisters, and her house mother at the SOS Children's Village.

PROJECT UPDATES

Post-Tsunami Reconstruction Projecty in Hut Bay, Andaman & Nicobar Islands

The November 2005 INSAF Newsletter carried the news that "Project Akshara" was being launched at a School in the somewhat hard-to-reach island of Hut Bay in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands of India. The project, in collaboration with the Hyderabad-based Shyamprasad Institute of Social Service, has started with a budget of \$5,000, with a first stage budget of \$3,400.

We are very pleased to report that the first phase of the project has been completed successfully. In January 2006, a total of 614 students received text books, and in the case of 12th grade students, syllabus guides and question banks. A career counseling workshop was organized to advise the students on their career choices. The workshop included counseling on teaching, public relations, journalism, law, hotel management, engineering, nursing, communications, music, and library Science as potential careers.

Sarawathy Vidyalayam, Eagandiyur, Kerala

Vasu & Lalitha Vasudevan, along with a group of friends, have embarked on an inspiring major initiative. Their idea is to raise \$75,000 for a school in Eangandiyur, Kerala. They got started in 2005 by raising \$9,750. The funds have been sent to the Deendayal Educational and Cultural Charitable Trust in Kundaliyur, Kerala, which is in charge of the local operations. Although they will try to raise the funds themselves, the group welcomes a contribution from other INSAF colleagues. We wish them complete success in building a "Kerala Nalanda" in Eangandiyur.

Improving Health & Education in Chhatisgarh

India PM Manmohan Singh recently has been reported worried about the Naxalite affected states such as Chhatisgarh. Tarun & Kamal Kothari's efforts with a \$10,000 contribution will help. It funds the Kothari Charitable Trust in Raipur, Chhatisgrah, dedicated to improving health & education for the needy. We hope to report more on this work in a future Newsletter.

Here is a happy update on a project started about 10 years ago. About 14 members of the Panjab University Class of 1969 decided to celebrate the 30th year of their graduation by raising about \$6,800 during 1996-1999. In early 2005, we were informed by P.U. that after awarding about \$1,000 in scholarships, about \$2,731 was left in the Scholarship Trust Fund. India had taught us enough arithmetic to see that the numbers did not add up. After a few appeals, the letter dated 20 March, 2006 on the right has been received (sorry, the original is very light) — concurring with our request that after considering interest earnings, over \$8,000 is now in the Trust Fund. Almost restores one's faith in P.U. bureaucracy.

Dear Sir,

Please refer to your letter dated 8.1.2006 on the subject cited above regarding clarification in the amount already indicated vide this office letter no. 625/S-IV/FC dated 13.12.2005.

In this regard, the office has re-evaluate the account information again and further apprise you that the donation accepted by the university for creation of endowments are being invested in the Bank in the shape of FDR's for the period depending upon the prevailing rate of interest. However, in this case, the university received the total amount i.e Rs. 2,53,490/- in parts from 1997-2000 from your goodself. Since its inception to 2004-2005, the interest accrued on the total endowment sum i.e Rs. 2,53,490/- comes up to Rs. 1,67,900/-. Hence, out of the interest received a sum of Rs. 45,000/- had already been disbursed in form of scholarships to the students. Thus, the balance amount keeping aside the Principle amount i.e Rs. 2,53,490/- is Rs. 1,22,900/-.

Keeping in view the above stated facts, if the Principle amount and the amount is being consolidated, the total amount available with the university comes up to the tune of Rs. 3,76,390/-1.e (Rs. 253,490/- +Rs.1,22,900/-) instead of Rs. 3,58, 769/- as shown by you in the letter.
