# INSAF LIKELY ON ITS WAY TO A RECORD YEAR

Year 2006 could prove to be another notable milestone for INSAF member supported projects — if the trend, as of this writing, continues for the rest of this year.

Major projects being initiated or sponsored by several families deserve special credit for this trend:

- Veteran members Joginder & Meera Kundra (New Jersey) have raised a substantial level of funding to support an array of projects of their choice.
- The generous family of Dr. Ashok and Dr. Hema Varma (Ohio) have elected to provide significant support to six different causes this year.
- The inspiring project in Kerala initiated by Vasu and Lalitha Vasudevan is getting a significant move forward this year.
- The ever exemplary efforts of Dr. Ram Chaudhari who has been covering a major part of significant expenses at an education society in Uttar Pradesh (The Bhulpur Shiksha Samiti).
- A special project by Perviz Walji and her sisters in memory of their respected parents, the late Hasham and the late Daulatkhanu Adam Walji, will provide access to education to children in the Kutchh area of Gujarat.
- Founder members Ashok and Darshan Mehan are supporting a number of projects this year.
- Former INSAF President Sudershan Bhateja and long-time member Ravi Manrao have joined together to support a substantial upgrade to the quality of education at the Government High School, Banbhauri, Punjab.
- Eight INSAF families are joining together to support the construction of two class rooms as well as to fund educational activities at the village of Ramalingapuram in Andhra Pradesh. This includes the Kundras and the Mehans mentioned above, along with the Palo Alto Group: AJ & Thankamma Poulose, Gopal & Shibani Chotani, Jairam & Shashikala Shetty, Manoj & Maneesha Shrivastav, Pushkraj & Padmashri Lad, and Bhavender & Kathryn Sharma.

Of course this doesn't cover all the efforts in 2006 — there are other efforts as well. We will have to wait until the Spring 2007 Newsletter to see the full Project Honor Roll for the entire year.

#### **BATLAHALLY JUNIOR COLLEGE**

INSAF President Soma and Parvathi Murthy have been long-time supporters of the former Batlahally School, now a Junior College. This year, the Murthys and INSAF have sent a combined contribution of \$225 to the college.

## **MUNGANAHALLI SCHOOL**

Here we have an illustration of "2 => 6". How's that you ask? INSAF President Soma and Parvathy Murthy converted their \$200 into \$600 for the Munganhalli school, which is located near Bengaluru, Karnataka. First, they added \$100 through the INSAF partial matching program to make it \$300. Then, they added \$300 through IDRF's (India Development & Relief Fund) matching program. Thus, the school received \$600 in the end. Well done, Soma.

## RISHIKESH SCHOOL PROJECT

In collaboration with All India Movement for Seva (AIM for Seva), Ashok & Darshan Mehan have sponsored the construction of a classroom at a new school being built in Rishikesh, Uttaranchal by AIM for Seva.

A contribution of \$2,400 has been sent this year to support this effort.

# ARYA PRITINIDHI SABHA, PONDICHERRI & GUJARAT

The Arya Pritinidhi Sabha America has an ambitious project on the anvil for Pondicherri. They are planning to construct facilities for displaced children at an estimated cost of \$500,000. Joginder & Meera Kundra were so impressed with this project that they have committed to providing \$51,000 during 2006-2007.

As of this Newsletter, the Kundras have sent \$25,000 to help support this effort. More on this project in a future Newsletter as further information becomes available.

The Arya Pritinidhi Sabha also runs an educational institution for poor children in Gujarat. Earlier this year, the Kundras sent a contribution of \$1,600 to support the education of 10 children there.


# CHILD SPONSORSHIP UPDATE


# VED CHAUDHARY NAMED TO NEW JERSEY ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPT POST

SHRI SAMARTH EDUCATION SOCIETY in Mumbai is planning to construct a 3-story building which will include an auditorium in addition to several classrooms and a few offices. The estimated cost of the project is about \$335,000. About \$3,750 have been contributed so far by Raj & Padmashri Lad with support from Ashok & Darshan Mehan, and Bhav & Kaye Sharma. Obviously more is needed. The Society educates over 2,200 students at various levels of studies.

The Club has several community service activities underway in the low-income tenements in Chennai and its suburbs. One such project is the education of children in these communities. Drs. Ashok & Hema Varma have sent a contribution of \$4,000 to help support the effort.

# KIDS WITH CAMERAS

"Kids with Cameras" organization teaches the art of photography to marginalized children in communities around the world. They use photography to capture the imaginations of children, to empower them, building confidence, self-esteem and hope. The award winning movie "Born Into Brothels" was made through this concept. Drs. Ashok & Hema Varma have sent a contribution of \$2,000 to help support the effort.

### PROJECT AKSHARA IN MYSOORU

**Arun and Padma Cariappa** are supporting the Pratham organization in Mysore with the goal of educating children in the slums of Mysore (renamed Mysooru as of Nov 1). The Cariappas have raised over \$6,500 for this worthy effort. The funds will be sent soon after the completion of certain formalities in India.

# SARASWATHY VIDYALAYAM, EANGANDIYUR, KERALA

Vasu and Lalitha Vasudevan have a wonderfully inspiring dream. They and their friends have a goal to raise \$75,000 over the next 3 years to complete and grow a school into a "Kerala Nalanda". The school is located in Eagandiyur, which is about 75 miles from Kochi, and is managed by the Deenadayal Educational and Cultural Charitable Trust.

The Vasudevans have sent \$13,300 this year to support this effort.

# OSDAV SCHOOL, KAITHAL, HARYANA

This year's Late Sh. Milkhi Ram and Late Smt. Kesra Devi Gulla Scholarship of Rs. 5,303 at the OSDAV School has been awarded again to Ashima Gandhi, now a student of class X. The scholarship was set up by **Manju and the late Bindi Chexal**.

As reported in an earlier Newsletter, an amount equivalent to Rs. 60,931 was sent at the end of Year 2005 to the OSDAV school in Bindi Chexal's memory by Manju and a few of Bindi's friends. A 10-member staff committee awarded the funds on July 31, 2006 to 21 students from the 6th to 12th grades at the school as full or partial tuition or school fee waivers.

# S.D. Higher Secondary School, Hoshiarpur, Punjab

Founding members Surinder & Nirmal Maheshwary have decided to honor the memory of respected Late Smt. Dwarka Devi with a scholarship at the Hoshiarpur school. A contribution of \$235 has been sent by the Maheshwarys to the school which Surinder once attended.

# Govt. School, Banbhouri, Punjab

Long-time member Ravi Manrao and former President Sudershan Bhateja have sent \$3,224 to the school at Banbhouri (near Ludhiana) to help upgrade the educational facilities. Sudershan may be able to visit the School early in 2007 to follow-up on the project.

# ADIVASI CHILD EDUCATION, LATHAKHAMAN, JHARKHAND

In Lathakhaman/Bhagachata, Jharkhand, Dr. Subhash Chandra, who is a 1967 Physics Ph.D. from Caltech and now retired after a long professional career in the US, runs a school through his Village Hope Foundation. The foundation is dedicated to the education of over 300 children. A check for \$5,000 has been sent recently with the sponsorship of the Kundras.

A recent news is that Holon Baa, the school's best teacher and an exceptionally honest man, received an offer (with higher pay) from a Govt. school. But, when Dr. Chandra told him that if Baa left, the school will have to be closed, Baa decided to decline the Govt. school offer, without asking for more money. Dr, Chandra has decided to raise Holon Baa's salary but this is indicative of the commitment teachers and the village people have towards their school.

#### PEACE CORPS VOLUNTEERS DONATE BOOKS

A group of Returned Peace Corps Volunteers, officially called INDIA X, who served in India during the sixties, organized a reunion in Harpers Ferry, West Virginia. As a service project, they decided to send some books to schools in India. Individual members purchased 13 books suitable for school children of various class levels.

INSAF's Kaye Sharma, a member of INDIA X, coordinated the project along with long-time INSAF supporter Raj Lad, who has kindly agreed to carry the books to India. Destinations: Punjab, Haryana, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh.

# WALJI RAPAR PROJECT, GUJARAT

In 2001, a major earthquake hit the Kutch - Bhuj area of Gujarat. It was one of two deadliest earthquakes to hit India in its recorded history. About 20,000 people were killed, 166,000 injured, and 600,000 left homeless. INSAF completed a project in 2001-2002 to build a 2-room school in Mithapur village in the Rapar Taluka in cooperation with two India NGOs.


Now in 2006, the Walji sisters (Dr. Laila Alidina, Naseem Walji, Perviz Walji, Nargis Walji, Raziya Gulamhussein, and Nasrin Jivani) have decided to honor the memory of their parents, the respected late Hasham and the late Daulatkhanu Adam Walji, by providing access to education for migrant children. Under this project, 42 migrant children will be provided early stage education by trained Bal Mitras (Friends of Children) as a first step towards entering main stream education. A contribution of \$1,000 has been sent to initiate the project; a second contribution of a similar amount is planned for early 2007 after completion of the first phase.

# UPDATES FROM THE VILLAGE ADOPTION PROJECT

A small group of INSAF families in Northern California, which informally calls itself the "Palo Alto Group" because many of them work in Palo Alto, along with two other INSAF families, has "adopted" a small village, Ramalingapuram, with the intent of a long-term commitment.

Ramalingapuram is near Chipurupalli in Andhra Pradesh, where Sodhana, an award winning Non- Governmental Organization is based. Sponsors are: Gopal & Shibani Chotani, Jay & Shashi Shetty, Manoj & Maneesha Shrivastv, AJ & Thankamma Poulose, Raj & Padmashri Lad, Joginder & Meera Kundra, Ashok & Darshan Mehan, and Bhav & Kaye Sharma.

A project support of \$1,200 sent at the end of 2005 has provided the following activities for 2006:

- 8 workshops for women's awareness
- 2 cultural awareness functions
- 1 medical camp
- 1 part-time teacher

For 2006, the target is to raise \$4,400, of which \$3,200 will add a classroom building at the village school in 2007. In an assay (in Telugu as shown on the left, bottom), fifth grader Bhagyalakshmi Gorala writes: "just as every person needs oxygen to live, every class needs a classroom". She and 7th grader B. Sanyasi Rao gave this and 12 other reasons why the additional classroom is needed.

On a related note, INSAF members Santosh Chokhani, Ashok & Darshan Mehan, with some support from Bhav & Kaye Sharma, also provide additional support to Sodhana. Through this other support, 11 talented students were paid small stipends to help continue their studies, and small levels of medical cost assistance were given to a few deserving families during 2005.
