32 donors were thanked for their project donations. 25 Schools were listed, which were to receive Paraag, Bal Sandesh \& Jagriti, or National Geographic for 1,2 or 3 years.

A letter to the Editor recommended annual membership increase to \$10/couple, and urging we seek voluntary donations for proposed projects.

## INCOME TAX EXEMPIION EXTENDED

This past summer, the Association was required to submit to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) our accounts for the last 5 years. The IRS was to decide whether to extend the income tax exemption granted to the Association in 1974.
In a letter dated August 16, the IRS informed the Association that its tax exempt status shall continue. Therefore, contributions to the Association continue to be US income tax deductible. As yet, we have not applied for a Canadian income tax exemption.

## 1978 ELECTIONS

The 1978 election has proved to be a non-election. Here's the story. Our election commissioner, Dr. Kuldip Singh, received a total of 4 nominations for the four executive committee positions. The following nominations were received with the consent of the nominees:

A report on the field work by Bhav Sharma, who took a 6-month sabbatical to do some field work in India.

The project included
teaching at 3
village schools in
Punjab during the Khalistan
militancy. With the help of the
teachers, needed items such as firstaid boxes, notice boards, black boards, benches and stools for students, carpets rolls, graph and English teaching aids,
thermometers, Indian atlases, library books etc. were provided with funds raised by FOPUAA. A handpump for drinking water was installed at one of the schools as there was a strong need for it there.

## SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

A check for $\$ 175$ was sent to the Government Girls School, Dhaneta, H.P. on behalf of Shashi and Amrit Chada. Subsequently, we received the acknowledgement letter from Mr. Hansraj Sharma.

We also received an acknowledgement for the $\$ 40$ sent to the D.D. High
School for Girls in Navsaid, Gujrat on behalf of Bhav and Kaye Sharma.
On July 27, 1987, the deputy registrar of Thaper Institute of Engineering and Technology sent us a letter acknowledging the receipt of $\$ 100$ for the Sonia Memorial Scholarship sponsored by Drs Chander and Renu Bhateja.

We also received a very nice letter from Sri P.L. Trakru, Principal of D.A.V. College in Jalandhar, thanking us for the $\$ 35$ in scholarship sponsored by Inderjit Paika.

## SODHANA

As you know, the association has been contributing to Dr. P.D.K. Rao's Sodhana project in Andhra Pradesh. We received a letter from Dr. Rao. Subsequently, Dr. Bhav Sharma visited him during his recent 6 month sabbatical to India. Here is a summary of communiques from Drs. Rao and Sharma.
".... Industrial Labor and even lower class employees in cooperative institutions come to us to seek our guidance and help in forming workers unions to fight for better working conditions and wages... Our rickshaw driver friends started constructing their colony whose total estimate is Rs. 720,000. The colony consists of 90 houses each at Rs $8,000 \ldots$ there was a 5 year legal battle with landgrabbers and rich........"
$"$. . . We offer help to college going youth from villages who associate with us and help us in our work. We provide them coaching, books, examination fees. Also, we rent a room for some of the boys to conduct their studies in a better atmosphere. We also provide meals to really poor boys so that they get balanced diet and improve their health. We also provide decent clothing to some of these boys. Our educational expenses come to nearly Rs 8,000 per year. We feel that we are not offering this as charity to them. These boys work hard and play a very useful role in our various activities. Quite a few of our boys coming from families which are totally illiterate are now graduates.... FOPUAA contributes $\$ 300$ to Sodhana's annual budget of $\$ 2,300-2,700 /$ year....

FOPUAA Becomes INSAF...

In today's world, you can bet on one thing being constant; that's change! FOPUAA is not immune to that. New members, new projects, members moving on to new jobs, ...... oh, I almost forgot, we have a new name for the organization! Four months after the polling process was initiated in October 1993, 70\% eligible members (based on 1993 membership dues payment) approved the name change. Here are some statistics: members on the mailing list -73 , members who paid 1993 dues -40 , members who voted -29 , votes approving name change -28 ( $70 \%$ of 40 ).
Votes were computed as described in the Oct. '93 P.A.L and the final points scored by each entry are as follows: BUAA - 122, INDIANA - 125, INDUAA - 130, INSAF - 152, VIDESH - 100. Therefore, INSAF will be the new name for our organization!

## Will the name of the newsletter change?

Yes. The newsletter will be called "INSAF Newsletter." This newsletter, on page 2, actually bears the new masthead and Page 2 onwards you will see the new appearance as well.

## Dr. Bhav Sharma on Name Change, Feb. 18, 1994

We have witnessed a wonderful and exciting step in the evolution of our association 20 years after its start up. Now our group has a new name: Indian Schools Alumni \& Friends (INSAF). And, this is while we continue, unchanged, our personal commitments to make a contribution to the meager resources that gave us our start.

Over the last few years, a consensus had evolved amongst us which said " let us expand our group's name from Punjab to India." But "what name should we have? " This question simply could not have a single "correct answer." Several PALs ago, one name was suggested by Ramesh and feedback was invited. This resulted in each of us getting a chance to evaluate 5 alternatives. ## Not so Frequently Asked Questions about INSAF

## WHEN AND HOW DID INSAF GET STARTED?

During 1971-72, P.K. Malhotra, Ash Mehan, and Bhav Sharma were housemates in New Brunswick NJ. P.K. and Ash worked locally as engineers, and Bhav was starting out in a Ph.D. program at Rutgers University. During the Holidays in Dec 1971, good friends and former classmates visited the 3 housemates. The group, all of whom were 1969 graduates in Chemical Eng from Panjab University Sector 14, Chandigarh, concluded after a good long discussion that we must give back as we got our start in India. This was the conceptual beginning.

Thus, along with the 3 housemates, the co-founders are:
Ashok Soni, Baljit Singh Gambhir, Bhim Sen Bhakoo, Keshyap Joshi, Rakesh Saini, Romel Singh Bhullar, Surinder Maheshwary, Vinod Arora, Vinod Bansal

In 1972, an Association named "Friends of Panjab University Alumni Association, USA (FOPUAA)" was formed. A senior Ph.D. student at Rutgers, Sudershan K. Bhateja, and the 3 housemates became the first Board (called Executive Committee then).

So, IF IT WAS FOPUAA AT THE START, WHEN DID IT BECOME INSAF? When DID IT BECOME AN IRS APPROVED 501 C3 NON-PROFIT?

FOPUAA became INSAF in 1994. Initial registration with the IRS as a nonprofit was in 1973 and full formal approval came in 1978. The Figure below provides an overview from the beginning to the end of 2022:


## WHY DID FOPUAA IN THE EARLY YEARS HAVE SOME BOARD MEMBERS FROM CANADA?

We had originally hoped to have a registered non-profit in both Canada and the United States as we also had members from Canada, some of whom volunteered for the Board. However, by the early 1990s, we came to realize that we did not have a critical mass of volunteers in Canada, and we decided to keep our focus in the United States.

More Not so Frequently Asked Questions about INSAF
HOW HAS INSAF'S GROWTH BEEN IN MONEY SPENT ON PROJECTS?
Project grants were modest for the first few decades. Growth started in late 1990s. Table below gives an idea of the trend.

## WHAT ABOUT IMPACT? WHAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED COLLECTIVELY IN 50 YEARS?

Those are tough questions. One perspective on the INSAF members collective accomplishments can be seen as follows:

- Over US $\$ 3.3$ million given back to help
- Over 1,000 cumulative annual projects (about 20-30 projects/Yr during the last 20 years)
- Over 1,000 donations made to INSAF for various projects
- Perhaps over 33,000 times when someone benefitted from INSAF grants (a guesstimate assuming US\$100 enough to make a difference for a given beneficiary)
